International Students Love Canada!

Canada was listed as the top most favorable destination for international students according to <u>CIC News</u> in 2023 because, "post-study work is the main, or an influencing, factor in where they choose to study and 72% said they would apply for a work visa after graduation." The Canadian Bureau for International Education (<u>CBIE</u>) says there are three main reasons students come to study in Canada. First is the quality of our educational system. Second is our reputation for being a tolerant culture. Third, Canada is known for being a safe nation.

Future Trends

The Statistics Canada <u>website</u> reported 388,782 post-secondary students in 2019. Although the International student population on post-secondary campuses has been record breaking through the 2010's, the Government of Canada put a temporary <u>two-year cap</u> on the number of education permits that will be issued. Study permits in 2024 will decrease 35% from the previous year. Factors for the decision included significant education fee increases and the housing shortage.

God Loves International Students, And So Should We!

The church has a mandate to welcome international students according to scripture. Deuteronomy 10:18-19 (NIV) states that God, "Loves the foreigner residing among you, giving them food and clothing. And you are to love those who are foreigners, for you yourselves were foreigners in Egypt."

Yet, they can struggle with loneliness, food insecurity, English language challenges, exam anxiety, a place to rent, and employment. Our advocacy for them can bring hope and encouragement. Practical Tips

Consider providing campus transportation to your church services for students. New Life Church in Castlegar, BC has been busing international students from Selkirk College to their church for years. This avenue of service provides a great connection for students to worship and fellowship.

Another way to serve is developing a network between your church and international students for home hospitality. Kelly Johnson is the Pentecostal chaplain at the University of Calgary and codirector of The Friendship Program: Home Away From Home that matches international students with host families in Calgary. Kelly says that the organization through the years, "Has over 750 graduate students connected to over 400 families in Calgary since about 2011 and are enjoying a good relationship with the University's Student and Enrolment Services as well as the Graduate Students Association." Isn't that amazing?

Churches with international students can also partner and coordinate with <u>International Student Ministries Canada</u> (ISMC) through their <u>Friends For Dinner</u> website connecting international students and local families. ISMC is active on dozens of campuses. They are always looking for churches to collaborate with. Another excellent partnership opportunity is <u>Alpha</u>. Churches can work with a campus ministry to host Alpha on or near a campus.
