Objective - to assess the following:

- How does Evangel, a Canadian Church (white / seniors) cultivate multiculturalism within their congregation?
- How do they embrace & assimilate new immigrants?

1. Who are all the immigrants you are targeting? (Nationality, Religion)

- Persians (aka Iranians)
- School and Work
- All are from a *M background, but not all are observant.

2. How are you approaching immigrants?

- Word of mouth
- Pre-pandemic, ESL normal/day-to-day stuff like work, shopping, ordering at a restaurant, job interviews, customer service, family, holidays, Canadian culture, etc.
- We invited to our church activities (Christmas, Easter, Sunday mornings, picnics/potlucks at the lake).
- We've watched the Jesus Film together, and used the Bible as an English textbook.
- Intentional to engage with the Persian community outside the church, e.g. attended memorial service after Flight 752 was shot down in Jan 2020

3. How do you bring awareness on multiculturalism in your church?

- Involvement with the University community (UNB)
- Currently there are people from the Middle East, Jamaica, Nigeria, South Africa and India in our weekly services.
- As we have a growing number of Iranians we have started including Persian/Farsi scriptures and songs in our worship times.

4. How is your church embracing newcomers?

- Our church continues to love people regardless of their country of origin.
- We incorporate different languages in our worship times
- We give platform space/airtime to different cultures
- We've been a historically strong global missions supporter
- There is good interaction and relationship between the different cultures in our congregation

5. In what are the ways you assimilate the new immigrants in your church?

- We do our best to include them in our family events, our church events, and encourage friendships to spend time outside "church".
- We provide help with finding government services designed for newcomers to the city/province/country (e.g., help them get their driver's license, apply for proper medical cards, find doctors/dentists, mechanics, etc. Several members of our church help with this.
- We've started a weekly Persian worship service and Bible study, and English speakers have started to join as well (it's reverse-assimilation).
- We've added a Persian believer to our church Pastors' Council.
