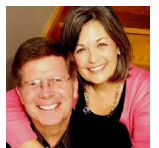

GOD IS AT WORK

in the World Today

Jesus said, "...upon this rock I will build My church; and the gates of Hades will not overpower it" (Matthew 16:18b, NASB). Despite contrary voices, falsely announcing the demise of the church, Jesus' words to Peter are perhaps truer today than ever. The kingdom is advancing. Jesus is building His church. The global church, the Pentecostal church, is not shrinking. It is growing.

The growth of the church is of paramount importance because God's heart is that none would perish; that all would come to repentance and faith in Christ. God's heart also leans toward the marginalized and the vulnerable. His compassion must provoke us to lift our eyes from our own wellbeing and to consider those with little or no access to the gospel, those in crisis and those needing access to the basic necessities of life. Jesus came to seek and to save the lost. He declared, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives, and recovery of sight to the blind, to set free those who are oppressed, to proclaim the favorable year of the Lord." (Lk 4:18-19) Jesus was a force of justice in the world and we are empowered to serve in that same anointing as we share the gospel in word and deed. Our focus must be on the socio-economically vulnerable who, being made in the image of God, deserve respect and care. And

justice demands that we focus on the eternal injustice of those who have no access to the good news. Oswald J. Smith stated, "No one has the right to hear the gospel twice, while there remains someone who has not heard it once."

We are answering "yes" to the Spirit's call to work with God in seeing his kingdom advance. We are privileged to partner with Christ in building his church to be the church in every country and amongst every tribe, nation, language and people.

Jesus is *still* building His church

- The greatest world-wide advancement of the gospel has taken place in the last 100 years. We rejoice that during this period of time, more than 3,000 full-time Canadian Pentecostals served as messengers of the gospel through the PAOC in over 80 countries.
- There are now more believers in the countries that were once "mission fields" than in the countries from which the missionaries were originally sent. Since our inception, the PAOC can celebrate the planting of over 50,000 churches overseas, the empowering of nearly 40,000 workers currently released into the harvest field, and the salvation of over 12 million people who have found Christ.

- The Pentecostal movement worldwide is growing faster than any other religion. We thank God that we can be a part of this and are grateful that over the past 20 years, International Missions has experienced a consistent increase in global workers deployed and resources released to the field.

Jesus is undoubtedly building His church. Yet the heart of the Good Shepherd, who would leave the 99 to go and find the one that is lost, compels us to look to those unreached by the gospel. Today there are 3.1 billion people living with little or no access to the gospel and there are 1.3 billion people who live in extreme poverty. God's heart inclines to those precious people.

International Missions Reimagined

When our regional directors and mission leaders gathered in the Fall of 2018, God birthed a holy discontent in our spirits. Despite our gratefulness for the great story of our 100-year history, we know that our work is not finished. We began to ask ourselves questions like:

- What kind of impact do we believe God is asking us to make in His world, by the power of the Spirit, in the next decade?

We were filled with faith for big, God-sized dreams.

- What changes do we need to make to ensure we are ready as a movement to fulfil God's purpose for us?

We developed a resolve to do what it takes, trusting God in the journey.

- How can we ensure that our global workers are focused and deployed to where there is the greatest darkness and the greatest opportunity for kingdom transformation?

We were compelled to increase our strategic focus towards two great needs in our world today: the least reached and the socio-economically vulnerable.

- How can we increasingly embrace and engage with our international network of churches and leaders from the majority world and break new ground for the kingdom?

We were convinced that our historical success in pioneer initiatives is also our future — as we partner with the emerging church to take the gospel to the least reached and socio-economically vulnerable.

Consequently, we engaged in a year-long process with our global workers, pastors, donors, staff, mission leaders and international partners to ascertain the Spirit's leading and prepare for the future. In order to achieve the greatest impact by 2030

we need to revisit and strengthen our foundations. The big God-sized dream we have is like the summit of a mountain. It is distant, momentous and often shrouded in mystery. In order to make an assault on that mountain peak, we must prepare base camp. Base camp reflects the kind of changes that we must make now, to ensure that we are positioned to assault the summit; to continue to be used by God in making disciples and advancing His kingdom around the world.

The activity of setting up base camp and the imagery of ascending the summit of missional impact in the future correlates with the biblical metaphor in Isaiah 54. Because we know that God has not led us towards a barren future, we choose to take the steps of faith now to lengthen the cords, strengthen the pegs, stretch out the curtains and enlarge the place of our tent.

*Enlarge the place of your tent,
stretch your tent curtains wide,
do not hold back;
lengthen your cords,
strengthen your stakes.
For you will spread out to the right
and to the left;
(Isaiah 54:2-3 NIV).*

Prioritizing the least reached and socio-economically vulnerable peoples of the world

There are 3.1 billion people in God's world who have little or no access to

the gospel. While there is much to celebrate, there is still an unconscionable number of people who have never heard about Jesus.

How can this be? The reality is that if every member of the global church were to share the gospel with every single one of their friends and relatives within their own cultural group, there would still be billions who won't hear it. These forgotten ones are the least reached; they have little or no access to the gospel unless someone responds in obedience to the missional call to cross cultural and linguistic barriers to present the gospel—even in places where it is restricted (illegal or dangerous).

Concurrent to this spiritual need is the stark reality that 1.3 billion people live in extreme poverty and the lack of basic necessities every day. Food security, human trafficking, lack of clean water, disrupted education, shortages among displaced people and other issues of justice continue to plague our world. As an expression of our mission, the PAOC is committed to care for the socio-economically vulnerable people of this world. We do this global workers' international and ERDO (Emergency Relief and Development Overseas) continue to provide food assistance, crisis response, child sponsorship and community development.

We recognize that the least reached peoples of our world and the

socio-economically vulnerable are often one and the same. The 10/40 window, comprises 69 countries, represents the largest grouping of people with little or no access to the gospel as well as 75% . 1 per cent of the world's poorest people people. The overlap between these two needs, spiritual and physical, necessitates an increasingly integrated response in our mission.

International Missions responds to both the injustice of little or no gospel access and the injustice of little or no access to the basic necessities of life. Our reaching lost people, our planting of communities of authentic disciples, our equipping of servant leaders and our caring for the poor and vulnerable is not done in isolation. The impact of the gospel, in word and deed, is best realized when reaching, planting, equipping and caring is done in collaboration and in unison.

“As we make disciples, our strategy prioritizes those with little or no access to the gospel, engages the next generation, works to alleviate poverty, cares for widows and vulnerable children, and addresses issues of justice.”

Because of the reality of the need in our world, we are compelled as an organization to not merely celebrate what the Spirit has accomplished through us in the past 100 years, but to renew our resolve for the century ahead. We are compelled to go because the task remaining is too significant to do anything less. The Spirit calls us to continue to make disciples around the world, among every people group, especially where the gospel is unwelcome and socio-economic realities create adversity. We are called to take the whole gospel to the whole world in partnership with the whole church.

Will you pray with us? God's mission requires engagement in the heav- enlies and advancement in prayer before we will see advancement in the field. We are committed to listen to the Spirit's prompting during these two years of strengthening

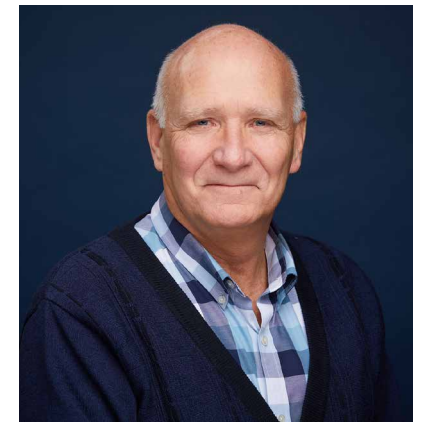
our foundations and preparing base camp, so that we can continue to experience the joy of partnering with the Lord of the harvest in seeing greater missional impact. Therefore, we ask you to pray.

- Pray for wisdom for the leadership – especially in responding to the learning from International Missions Re-imagined and the leading of the Spirit in preparing for future missional impact (James 1:5).

Kingdom PRAYERS

Thy Kingdom Come, Thy Will Be Done, On Earth as it is in Heaven

The Lord's Prayer calls for God's people to pray that the kingdom of God will come on earth in the same way that it exists in heaven. That is an incredible invitation to participate with God and impact history from the human side. As you pray for a lost world and for our global workers, our Mission Canada workers and our global family and partners around the world, please pray the Word of God over them. Ask the Lord to give us the nations as our inheritance, the ends of the earth as our possession for His glory.

1. Pray that God's Word will accomplish the purposes for which He sent it.

"...so is my word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it" (Isaiah 55:11).

God's Word is a powerful, two-edged sword that is greater than any political, economic or social challenges and trends. Pray that God's Word in written, oral, musical and dramatic forms will be proclaimed in every community in our world.

2. Pray that the Holy Spirit will draw men and women to Himself and that blind eyes will be opened

and the glory of God will be revealed.

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light" (Matthew 11:28-30).

People are weary and burdened by the reality of sin and all its consequences. Only the Holy Spirit can open their eyes to the need for salvation that comes from repentance and leads to new life and joy in Jesus. Pray that God will draw hundreds of thousands of people into the rest of salvation.

"I am sending you to them to open their eyes and turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan to God, so that they may receive forgiveness of sins and a place among those who are sanctified by faith in me" (Acts 26:17b-18).

False religions and deceptive ideologies have blinded men and women in every nation to the truth of the gospel. Pray that God will unveil the beauty and glory of the cross and break through the veil that blinds the minds and hearts of so many. For

“whenever anyone turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away” (2 Corinthians 3:16).

“Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. He who has ears, let him hear” (Matthew 13:8-9).

The Spirit of God is always at work before the messengers arrive with the good news. Pray that the Spirit will prepare the hearts and minds of unbelievers to hear and to understand the truth of the gospel.

3. Pray that the Spirit of God will be poured out on all flesh.

“...I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your old men will dream dreams, your young men will see visions. Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days. I will show wonders in the heavens and on the earth...” (Joel 2:28-30a).

God has promised to pour out His Spirit on men and women, young and old, rich and poor. Pray that God will give visions and dreams to our workers and our partners around the world. Pray that millions will have powerful divine encounters, and be saved and empowered as God’s witnesses by the Spirit of God.

“Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. And pray for us, too, that God may open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains. Pray that I may proclaim it clearly, as I should. Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity. Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone” (Colossians 4:2-5).

Pray that our workers and all believers would proclaim the message of the gospel clearly, making the most of every opportunity God places before them. Pray that they will always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks them to give the reason for the hope that they have (1 Peter 3:15). Pray that they will show gentleness and respect even if people speak evil of them or mistreat them.

4. Pray for the peace and prosperity of the nations.

“I urge, then, first of all, that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone—for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness” (1 Timothy 2:1-2).

The Bible encourages us to pray for the peace and prosperity not only of Jerusalem (Psalm 122), but also for those among whom we live. We send our workers into countries experiencing turmoil and often significant poverty. Pray that God will bring peace and prosperity to the nations, and that the churches we plant will be self-sustaining because the believers are being blessed by God. Pray for justice for the poor, the oppressed, the refugees, the orphan and the widow.

5. Pray for the fruit of salvation to remain and for believers to experience true freedom in Christ.

“I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God” (Ephesians 3:16-19).

In many places in the world, when a person comes to faith in Jesus Christ, there can be great persecution and opposition. Pray that God will strengthen those new to the faith

and give them courage and power to stand. Pray also that they will understand that hope for forgiveness and acceptance with God is only possible through the work of Christ on the cross. Pray that people will not rely on a works-based salvation that can lead to legalism rather than freedom.

6. Pray that Jesus will unite His body, the church.

“I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one: I in them and you in me. May they be brought to complete unity to let the world know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me” (John 17:20b-23).

The unity of the followers of Jesus is a powerful witness to the truth of the gospel. Pray that God will unite Christians around the world to work together to reach those who have never heard the gospel, and that they will be united into the body of Christ. Pray that the love of Christ will reconcile broken relationships and heal wounded hearts so that the witness of His church will be clear and triumphant.

7. Pray for more workers (Luke 10:2, Matthew 9:37-38).

“Then he said to his disciples, ‘The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.’”

Jesus encouraged us to pray for men and women who will give their lives to reach people without Christ wherever they are. There remain many who are living as part of Unreached People Groups (UPGs), who have never heard a clear presentation of the good news. It is God who calls and empowers people to do His work, but He invites us to ask Him to send them. Pray for more global and Mission Canada workers, and for hundreds of pastors, evangelists and teachers around the world.

8. Pray for passion, courage and soundness of mind.

“For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. For God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and of self-discipline. So do not be ashamed to testify about our Lord...” (2 Timothy 1:6-8a).

God has given His followers a spirit of power that sets us free from fear and timidity so that we can boldly proclaim the truth of the gospel.

The world is full of uncertainty and danger. But “we are not of those who shrink back and are destroyed, but of those who believe and are saved” (Hebrews 10:39), so pray for courage to face the dangers that come with the mission.

9. Pray for financial resources to support the work of all our workers.

“Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work” (2 Corinthians 9:6-8).

The Scriptures call us all to generosity and to break the power of Mammon in our lives by giving generously. Pray that God will inspire the church in Canada to sow generously so that the ministry will not lack the resources necessary to fulfil God’s purpose. Our workers are worthy of our support and need adequate finances to accomplish all that God asks of them.

10. Pray for joy and steadfast endurance in the face of persecution.

“Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

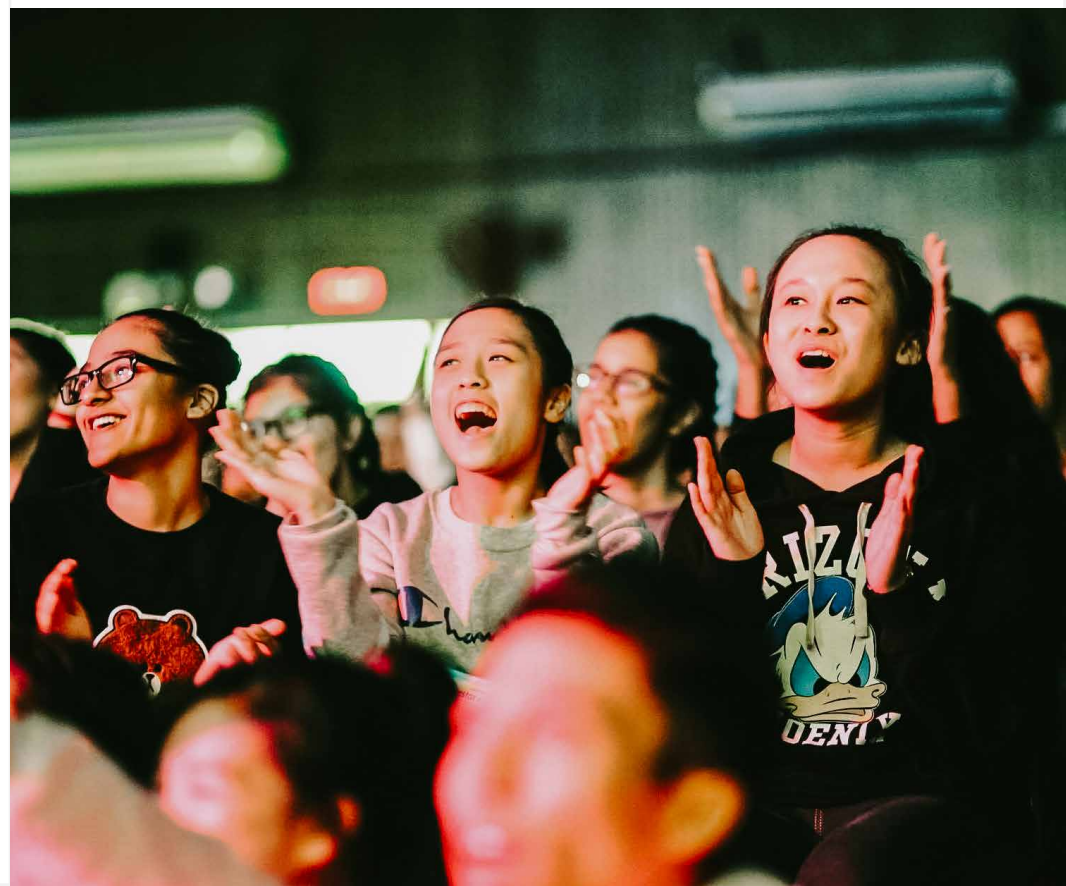
“Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you” (Matthew 5:10-12).

“To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps” (1 Peter 2:21).

In 2013, we started a community centre which provides computer, sewing and other job skill classes. Many disabled people and widows have little to no chance of gaining practical job experience without the centre. This has been a source of hope for people who are now able to find work. A church also operates out of the centre, so that in addition to practical needs being met, people are being spiritually revived through counselling and peer mentoring. Hearts are being touched, behaviours changed, addictions broken and diseases healed. We want to increase church plants from eight to 25 in the next 10 years, and create more crisis centres for youth outreach, ministry training, and job skills training.

- For fruitful ministry - that house churches will expand to 25 in the next 10 years.

These "called workers" serving around the world need a strong support team back home. The PAOC's International Missions (IM) Department, located at the International Office in Mississauga, Ontario, gives our global workers this much-needed support. We provide strategic direction, vision, training, administrative support, monitoring and evaluation, member care, and help in navigating the governmental and health requirements in the countries they serve. The home team also facilitates the use of communications and web-based tools for more effective messaging and promotion, and are available for crisis intervention and emergency care. We ensure that finances are efficiently transferred, and all Canada Revenue Agency regulations are followed.

Key Ways to Pray for the IM Team

1. Pray that God will enable us to continue serving the diverse needs of our PAOC global workers with patience, tenacity, and creativity.

AFRICA REGION

Africa is a place where Spirit-empowered Christianity is rapidly growing. In spite of significant economic and political challenges in many nations and strong religious differences that often produce conflict, the gospel advances every single day and now it touches almost half the population of Africa. In our history PAOC missionaries have taken the gospel to over 100 tribes in more than 20 countries. Over 23,000 churches have been planted and over 20,000 workers trained and released into God's harvest field. In the last 25 years, there has been significant growth in Islamic communities and unreached people groups. God is currently mobilizing our 28 related fellowships to take the truth of Christ to those parts of the continent that have yet to hear it. The need is still great—almost 374 million Africans in 988 people groups living primarily in North and West Africa still have no viable access to the gospel.

Wherever we have historically served in Africa, we have seen tremendous work and fruit. The challenge and opportunity we now have is to work into the north and west of the continent to engage unreached people groups. These areas are very difficult. The PAOC Africa Team has two strategies to meet the need of Africa's unreached:

1. The mobilization of the African church in missions.

2. The recruitment of apostolically gifted individuals or couples to work alongside the African church in joint missional initiatives.

There remains incredible need and opportunity for the growth of mission initiatives into many difficult portions of the continent.

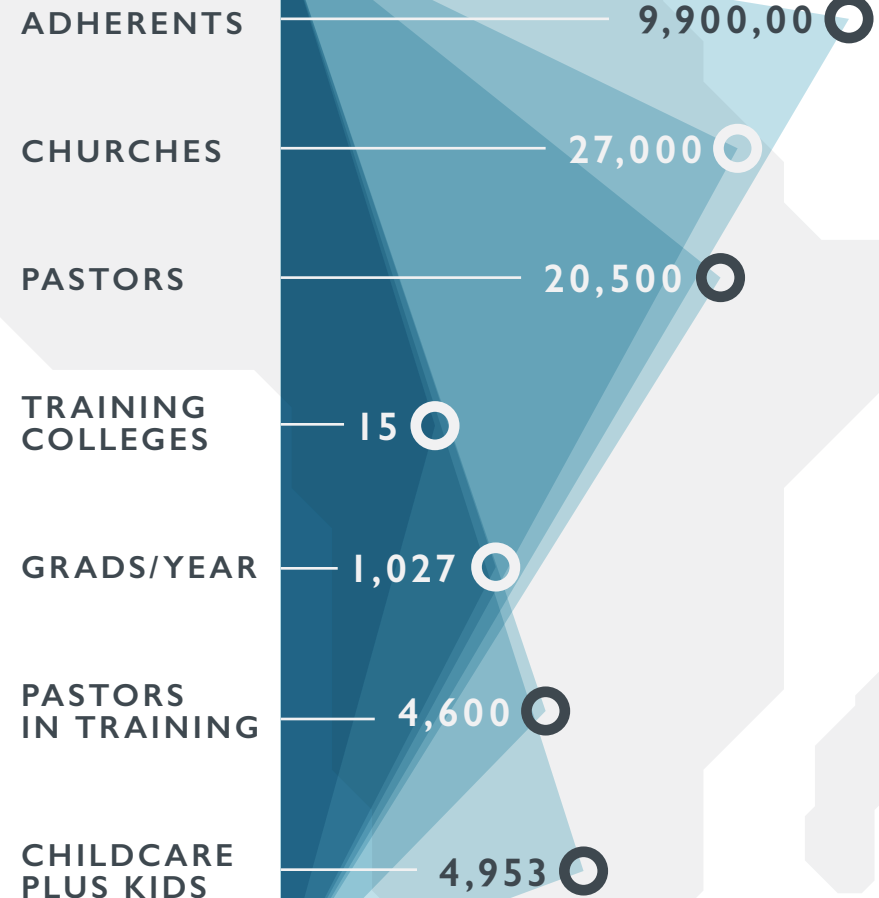
Please pray:

- For the critical development of a missionary vision among all the churches of the PAOA (Pentecostal Assemblies of Africa). Bishop Simon Peter Emiau is leading this initiative from Uganda.
- For a generation of missionaries to Africa to be raised up and mobilized.
- For the Lord to call young, apostolically gifted individuals or couples to join the Africa Team. They will be deployed initially to Senegal and Ethiopia to develop contextualized ministry capability. Our vision is to see them used of God, together with the Pentecostal Assemblies of Africa (PAOA), to influence Africa's 374 million unreached people.
- For divine breakthroughs among people who are most resistant to the gospel, with the Africa Team producing eternal fruit that will abound to His honour and glory.

EURASIA REGION

As we celebrate 100 years of PAOC missions, remember that our Fellowship did not send missionaries to Europe until the 1980s because we saw it as a Christian continent. Things have changed and Eurasia is now a post-Christian region with secularism as the dominant “faith.” Once the catalyst of Christianity, Europe is now more like the catacomb. Great cathedrals stand empty in every major city, a metaphor for the state of the church. In 40 per cent of the region’s 50 countries, only one per cent or less of the population are evangelical believers. In some areas, persecution and opposition exist, and in others, fear of terror attacks has become a new reality. Waves of refugees are buffeting European shores, human trafficking keeps thousands in

sexual slavery, and alcohol and drug addiction hold millions of others in bondage. Christians and church leadership need to be strengthened by our prayers as they seek to re-evangelize the continent and evangelize many minority groups (e.g. Muslims) for the first time.

In John 5:17, Jesus reminds us that “My Father is always at his work.” This is true even in post-Christian Europe ... praise God! We can see the hand of God working and the Holy Spirit doing great things in answer to prayer.

- There has been a revival among the Roma (gypsies) of Central Europe.
- Hundreds of churches have been planted in Russia, Ukraine and other Eastern European nations since the fall of communism.

- Hundreds more churches are being planted in Western European nations like Spain and France.
- Hundreds of addicts have found freedom and deliverance in Christ through Teen Challenge programs springing up across the region.
- There has been a 3,000 per cent per cent increase in Jewish believers in Israel (from under 1,000 to over 30,000) in the last 35 years.

While we celebrate these great victories, we realize there is still much to be done. The Eurasia Strategic Plan calls for reaching those with the least access to the gospel primarily through collaboration with national partners in planting hundreds more churches, equipping hundreds of national leaders, and caring for the socioeconomically vulnerable. This begins on our knees: “The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective” (James 5:16). Thank you for praying!

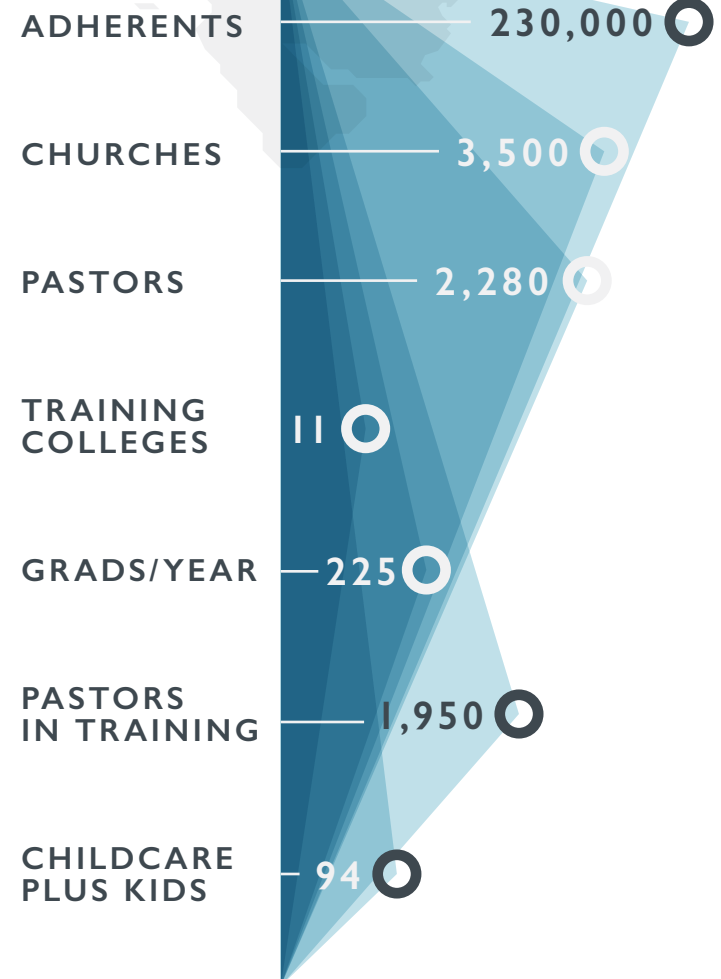
1. For receptivity to the gospel message and open doors of ministry for our global workers, national partners, churches and training institutions.

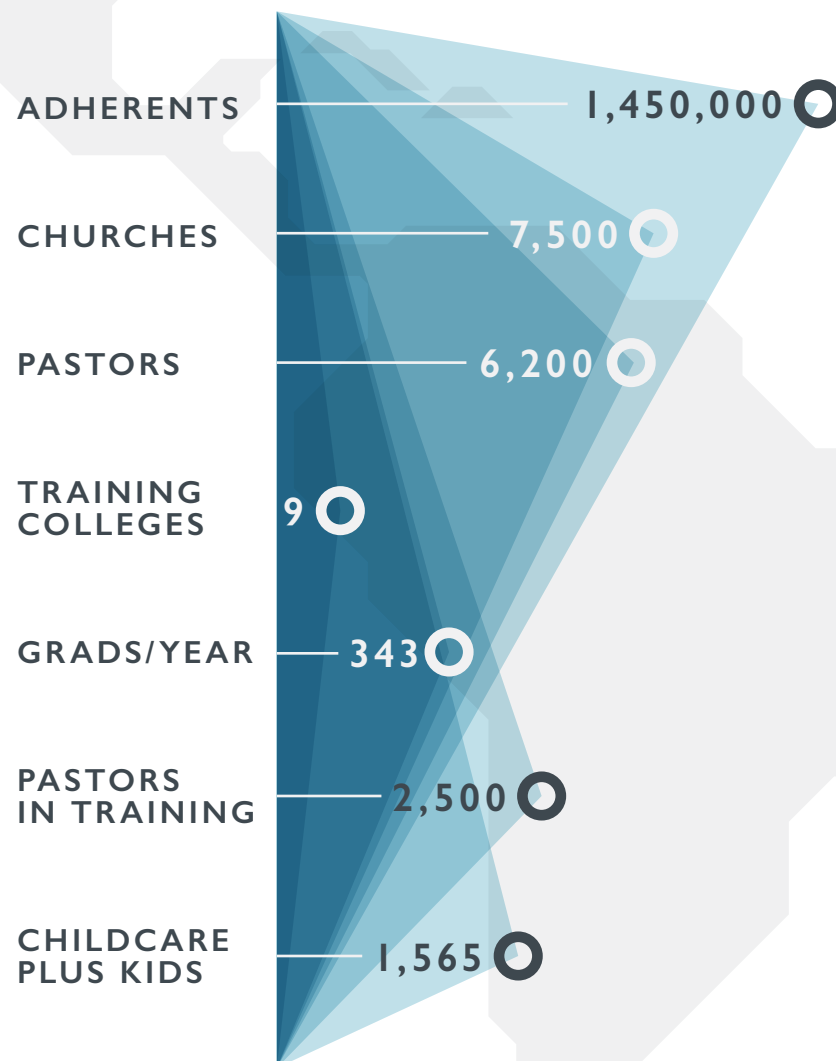

SOUTHEAST ASIA REGION

The Southeast Asia (SEA) region spans from India in the west to Japan in the east. It is home to over 2.5 billion incredibly diverse people and some of the world's largest and most lively cities. While our region is the centre of Hinduism, Buddhism, Islam, and Sikhism, it is also home to one of the fastest conversion rates in the world. At the beginning of the 20th century relatively few Christians lived in Asia. Now they make up eight per cent of the Asia Pacific Region. The growth of Christianity is twice that of the general population, with Pentecostals growing at an unprecedented rate. From 1970 to 2020, Pentecostals and Charismatics will have grown from 9.3 million people to 165.6 million people. So while half of all the world's unreached people groups can be found in Southeast Asia, so can some of the world's largest churches and most dynamic ministry initiatives.

Our team of entrepreneurial PAOC global workers are part of the story of God's move in Asia. From large urban church plants to university cafés, from children's education centres, schools, and theological training sites to rural children's homes, and from faith-based enterprise to social development, Canadian Pentecostals are participating in a historic move of God in Asia. They stand alongside national fellowships and leaders who have

often paid an extreme price to serve Jesus.

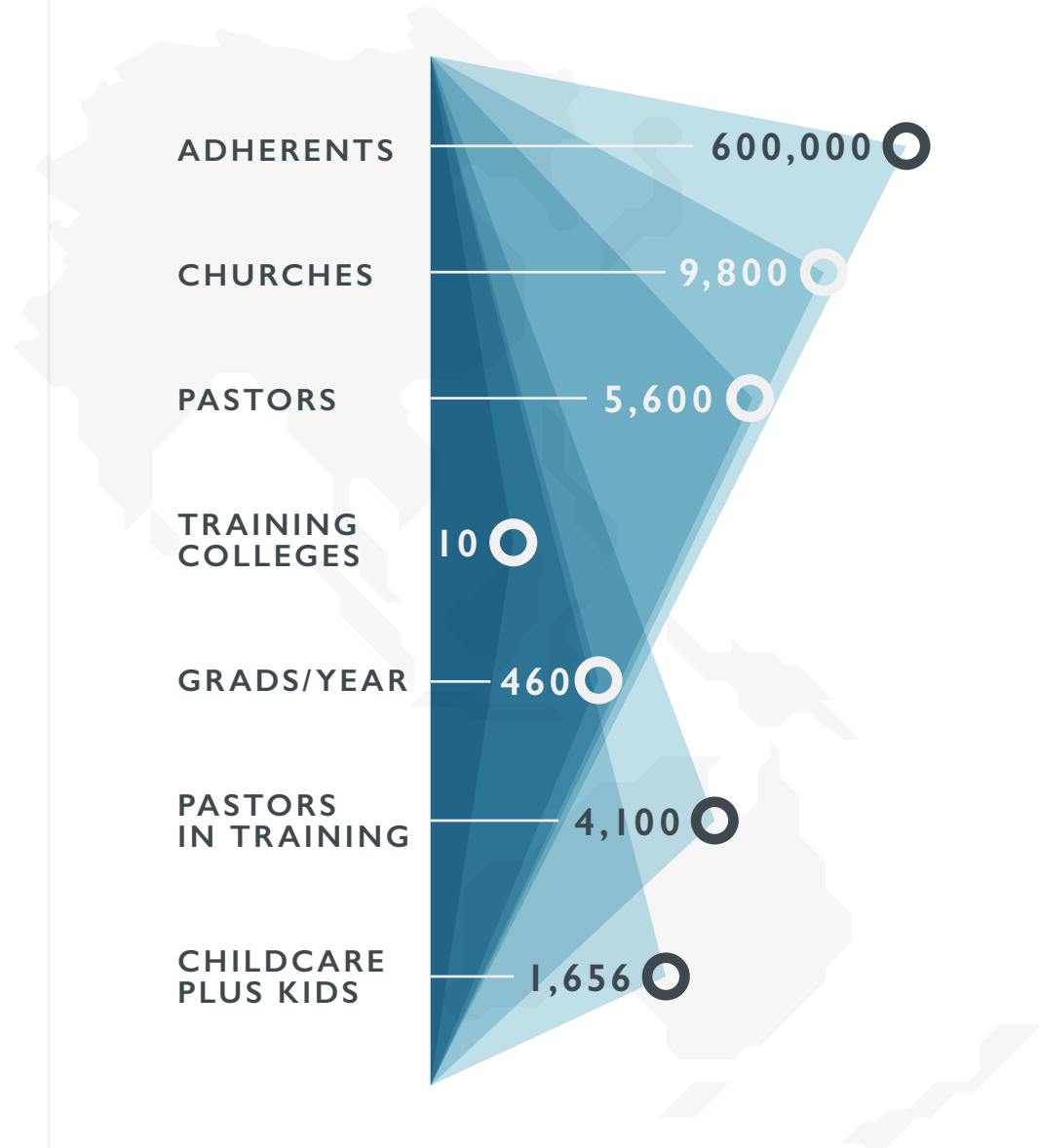
Please pray:

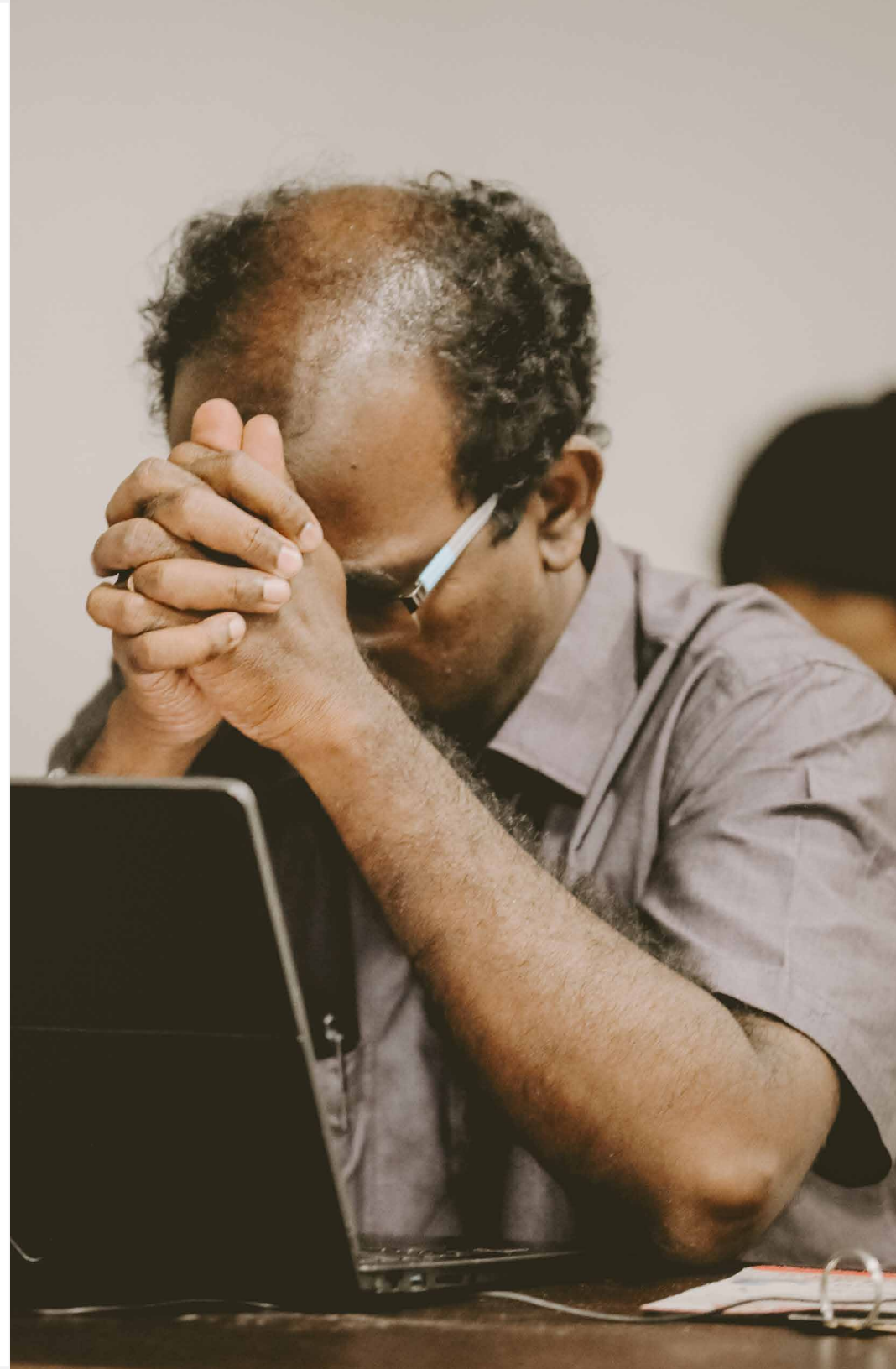

ASIAN OUTREACH

Asian Outreach, in partnership with the PAOC, is a dynamic network of Christian non-governmental organizations in multiple Asian countries. Partnering together with churches, companies, governments, foundations and individual people like you, we have been empowering and transforming lives in Asia for over 50 years. As an international alliance of like-minded ministries from over 10 countries, Asian Outreach staff are committed to working alongside local leaders and international partners to inspire hope and offer practical help for sustainable transformation across Asia. Although Asia is home to over 60 per cent of the world's seven billion people and is presently spearheading much of the growth of the global economy, many of its inhabitants are trapped in an unrelenting poverty cycle. We believe that sustainable transformation is possible in at least four dimensions—economic, physical, social and spiritual.

Economic

Bringing economic sustainability into at-risk homes is an AO priority. With a focus on women and children at

risk, AO staff work with families to better understand the reasons for financial instability in homes and communities. Through skills training, micro-enterprise and micro-finance, many communities are being lifted out of extreme poverty. Coupled with the Good News, hope brings transformation.

Physical

Basic human needs can be better provided for in relevant and sustainable ways, e.g. water, food, education, health care, shelter and disaster preparedness.

Social

The opportunity for all people to live in a just and equitable community, with good governance and leadership in all sectors, can be realized by advocating for equality, justice, sound laws and policies. Ethics, morals and values are being taught by AO staff in classrooms and homes.

Spiritual

People deserve the opportunity to hear the Gospel. The understanding

that “All” are made in His image is a message that resonates and transforms lives. Sharing this Good News is an integral part of every project, every aspect of what Asian Outreach does in each community we work in. AO believes in standing alongside the national church as it reaches the unreached.

Here are several high priority areas of focus for AO:

Community development

Clean water, income and food security and basic health care are benefits that many in Asia do not have access to. We work with governments and local leaders to assess needs and provide practical programs for at-risk communities in order to address extreme poverty. We provide training and resources, such as: water and sanitation projects (wells, bio-sand filters and latrines) and intensive agricultural training.

Education

One of the keys to ending poverty is providing knowledge, understanding and holistic education. Many children do not have the opportunity to go to school, or they drop out due to illness, migration or economic hardship. We assist children and work with their communities and families to better understand the value and potential of education. We help teachers and schools develop better curriculum, services and resources.

Business training and micro-loans are also made available to at-risk families, along with other formal and non-formal educational opportunities.

Next generation leadership development

The pressing need in fast-developing Asian countries is to raise and equip national leaders. AO invests in leaders so that the emerging generations in Asia become people of integrity, vision and capacity. Training priorities include professional, personal and non-formal courses that provide practical skills to help them influence and change their society. Key values we uphold are national leadership, indigenous vision and local ownership.

Spiritual development

We are convinced that for individuals and communities to be truly transformed, they also need to have and own a sense of hope, dignity, worth and purpose. We equip, resource and empower local churches to take responsibility for providing practical relief and sustainable solutions to their communities. This includes sharing how people can discover their full potential through the love and person of Christ.

Partner development

We see ourselves as “vision partners” who work alongside our many associates—churches, community

leaders, businesses, foundations and individuals like you. Together we want to develop, empower and equip our partners and their vision with training opportunities, conferences, prayer resources, short-term field visits and longer-term opportunities. Through such collaboration and joint development, we can truly see effective and meaningful change happen for all involved.

EMERGENCY RELIEF & DEVELOPMENT OVERSEAS (ERDO)

Prayer is dynamic. Why? Because it has layers to it.

There is a layer of appreciation. There is something sacred and special about taking time out of the day God has given you to talk to Him and express your love for Him. This reveals a side of devotion and is the highest praise that you can give to God.

There is a layer of recognition. It's no secret that we cannot physically see God. Prayer is a way of letting God know that we acknowledge His presence and desire to be in it because we believe.

There is a layer of intimacy. God's presence is not a space for shame. Revelation becomes brewed in a space of openness, never forgetting that God bore our shame for us.

There is a layer of building. When you talk to God, you are building multiple things: your faith, your relationship with Him, His kingdom, your boldness to speak the gospel which is a foundation for others – your prayers can be connected to someone's salvation.

Prayer is dynamic. Why? Because God is dynamic. He has many layers

for us to discover, in order to experience the fullness of His glory, mercy and love (John 1:16).

At ERDO, we strongly believe in the power of prayer and its dynamism. We thank you for taking the time to join hearts with us as we pray for our ministry's activities and as we continue to help others in the years ahead. The following prayer points are grouped into three areas that need not only your attention but God's intervention.

As you pray earnestly, remember that prayer is layered with all things good and all things God. Don't forget to pray for yourself, that God may reveal Himself and that you will experience His many layers.

CHILD SPONSORSHIP

ChildCARE Plus (CCP) is ERDO's child sponsorship program. Through the monthly support of loving Canadian sponsors, children are able to not only attend school on a regular basis and have access to nutritious food and health care, but also receive spiritual nurturing and teaching by our on-the-ground CCP field

representatives (mainly PAOC global workers). The CCP program focuses on education, knowing that without it, children in developing countries can remain trapped in poverty. They will struggle with unemployment, homelessness and the constant threat of hunger, malnutrition and disease. The current impact of CCP sponsorship is forever changing the lives of over 8,200 children in 29 countries each year. Through the CCP program and the support of Canadian sponsors, thousands of children have access to quality education, know the love of Christ, and have hope for their future.

Prayer Requests:

- That children may use their discovery of Christ as a tool to grow not only in their potential but also their faith.
- That children's relationship with their sponsors will be built on healthy conversations, the love of Jesus, and biblical teaching.
- That more people will open their hearts to sponsor a child in need.
- For God's protection over every child, inside and outside the CCP programs, so that they may live to see what God has planned for their lives.
- For children with special needs, that they may feel the love of Christ even in times of difficulty.
- For the older children who have been awaiting sponsorship. Pray that doors may open for them to move into the next phase of their

lives – graduation, post-secondary school, jobs.

- For the global workers and program partners in our countries of operation. May God strengthen them, remove barriers, and equip them to bring the gospel to children.
- That current sponsors will recognize the impact they have on their sponsored child(ren) and their resources will match the heart they have to bless others.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Community development offers longer-term solutions to poverty and injustice. ERDO's community development projects range from teaching farming techniques and raising income-generating farm animals for food relief and security, to WASH (water, sanitation and hygiene) initiatives, microfinance, vocational training, employment skills, and health initiatives through nutrition programs.

Prayer Requests:

- That solutions to issues related to community poverty will remain effective.
- Pray against any division or conflict aimed at harming community building.
- That the work done will be maintained and upheld by not only workers but also beneficiaries.

- That community development issues will be treated with the same level of urgency and generosity as our emergency responses.
- That every investment given to an individual or community (whether intangible or tangible) may grow to become more than what was given and expected.
- That hearts will be touched and not be hardened when receiving the love of Christ.

CRISIS RESPONSE

As the humanitarian agency of The Pentecostal Assemblies of Canada, ERDO reaches out by providing timely assistance to people facing emergency situations. When a crisis or natural disaster strikes, ERDO completes a rapid assessment of our in-country response capacity and determines how we can complement and enhance the work already taking place. The first phase of crisis response typically includes appropriate food, clean water and necessary relief supplies. The second phase focuses on assisting people to rebuild shelters as they return to their homes or homeland. The third phase assists people in re-establishing their livelihoods. We are so grateful for the ongoing generous and compassionate responses of our Fellowship during times of great need.

Prayer Requests:

- For the vulnerable children and families who are at risk of malnutrition due to famine conditions.
- For peace so that internally displaced refugees and those in neighbouring areas can return to their homes.
- For the faith of all those facing crises, that they may rely on their Heavenly Father for revival and redemption.
- That God's hand will protect all those who find themselves in a natural disaster, political conflict or chronic poverty.
- That Canadians will continue to respond to needs around the world, and not become weary after repeat emergencies, e.g. areas of chronic flooding, famine, etc.

Equip verb 'i-'kwip: to make ready

GlobalEd is the equipping arm of PAOC International Missions.

We believe that one of the most fruitful ways that we can be on mission with God is to equip those called to be part of God's work in the world, so that they can be faithful in ministry. We exist to make ready for service leaders who will make disciples everywhere, build and multiply communities of faith, and advance the kingdom of God into all sectors of society for His glory.

We collaborate in the equipping mandate with a dynamic team of Canadian global workers and an energized international network of church partners. We currently serve 50 international ministry training centres.

GlobalEd provides comprehensive support for these centres and their programs. We conduct strategic consultation with leaders, raise funds for capacity building projects, support the placement of effective teachers, and help to assure quality learning for students.

These equipping centres have produced an army of workers that continues to lead the rapid expansion of the church, many sacrificially taking the good news to the unreached. These equipped national workers are the fruit of our collaborative partnerships and the expression of our God-given vision. Please pray for these vital ministry training centres. Pray that they will remain focused on their mission and effective at equipping their students.

The Timothy Fund program is an effective investment in the equipping of national workers. Students filled with passion for serving God in ministry but who do not have the means to pay for the fees receive scholarship support for their studies. This is not only a great blessing for students but helps our partner schools collect the tuition revenue needed to make them stronger and help them to grow. We are so thankful for generous donors who value investment in equipping national church leaders. 2019 marks 10 years that the Timothy Fund has provided scholarships. The return on this investment is eternal. Please pray for generous donors who will invest in the future of the global church.

This year we are launching the GlobalEd Institute which will be housed at Summit Pacific College.

The institute is a vehicle that will provide global and Canadian mission-equipping solutions. There is an urgent need to provide ministry training for those serving as pastors who have never participated in any biblical ministry training. Our objective in establishing the Ministry Essentials Training Program is to create a structured non-formal ministry training initiative which will equip leaders who have little or no access to formal theological education. The training will be biblically and theologically foundational, practical in orientation, flexible in delivery for various purposes, and provide a reputable certificate upon completion.

The Ministry Essentials Training Program will ensure that students are equipped for fruitful ministry. They will be effective in battling the danger of uninformed doctrine and practice that can arise when church leaders are not biblically grounded through training. Please pray for this new initiative to be successfully launched.

Another focus for the GlobalEd Institute is the equipping of Canadian global workers. Training programs will ensure relevant pre-departure training and ongoing in-service learning for those called to global mission work. The institute will connect with our Canadian Bible colleges

and provide opportunities to extend preparation for global mission work to international venues. It will also be a catalyst for the development of new global worker training programs such as teaching English as mission and business as mission. Our prayer is that our heart for the mission of God and our engagement in equipping will initiate and grow missional fellowships globally. As John Stott said, "We must be global Christians with a global vision because our God is a global God."

Expanding support for equipping work through GlobalEd is a vital part of our vision to make disciples everywhere for the glory of God. Therefore we need your help. The effectiveness that GlobalEd has demonstrated and the potential for even greater impact in the future is dependent upon the prayer and the financial support of individuals and churches that are prompted to invest in national leaders. A call to prayer for Christ-followers where the gospel is restricted.

The world has shrunk. There are no longer geographically inaccessible nations on the planet. Yet there are still people who do not have access to the gospel. The Centre for the Study of Global Christianity estimates that 86 per cent of the Muslims of the world have never met a true follower of Christ. They live where the message of Christ is often blocked.

This is true not only for Muslims, but also for millions of unreached Hindus, Buddhists and inhabitants of countries under atheist regimes.

Pray for Spirit-inspired, creative strategies that are needed in these nations to penetrate cultures and see churches planted.

- Pray for the 10/40 Window, home to the majority of the world's un-evangelized peoples and much of the world's conflict and suffering.
- The violent realities of this region bombard our nightly newscasts. Pray that victims and perpetrators alike will hear the good news of Christ.
- Pray that God will call believers to go and live in these areas to share the truth about Christ.

Pray for our RAN (Random Access Network) Home Team.

- RAN exists to glorify God by mobilizing, preparing and deploying effective disciple-makers to serve among the people groups of the world who are known to be unreached and unengaged with Christ's gospel.
- RAN is a global participant, providing access to places where the church of Jesus Christ does not yet exist. Seven thousand people groups in our world still remain unreached. Almost 3,000 of these groups have no known Christian witness at all. They live in the deepest conditions of spiritual darkness.

Pray for the harvest that is taking place among people groups who have been historically isolated from the gospel.

- Over the last four decades, the church in Asia has not only taken root but is growing in transformational ways. During that same period, more Muslims have come to Christ than in the entire history of missions. As the church continues to grow, there is an ever-increasing need for disciple-making leaders.

Pray for business and community development projects.

- These initiatives create local employment, enabling global workers to live and work in RAN contexts. Their life and work can then engage indigenous peoples, producing authentic relationships. Through prayer and by God's grace, discipling takes place as a result.

Pray for RAN's Purpose.

- Pray that RAN will make Spirit-filled disciples and plant multiplying fellowships of indigenous believers, particularly where a non-missionary-identity, a pioneer approach and creative strategies are required.

Pray for RAN's Field.

- Pray for the walls of isolation to be penetrated and the good news to break through.
- Pray for open doors and open hearts in Restricted Access Nations, which restrict access to the gospel for the people within their borders.

Pray for RAN's Focus.

- Pray that God's revelation would reach all unreached peoples as we "go."
- Pray for the (nearly) 7,000 Unreached People Groups (UPGs) in our world (defined as a population that is less than two per cent evangelical or less than five per cent Christian). These

groups lack enough followers of Christ and resources to evangelize their own people.

Pray for RAN's Priority.

- Pray that the Lord of the Harvest would "call labourers" from PAOC churches to the unengaged peoples of our world.
- Pray for Unengaged People Groups—people groups which are understood to not only be "lost" and "unreached," but who have no incarnational gospel witness of any sort among them.

Villages of Hope: Africa Society (VOH Africa) was birthed by PAOC global workers who saw an increasing need to care for and bring hope to orphans and vulnerable children in Africa. VOH Africa is a Canadian charitable organization registered with the CRA.

We currently have ten locations in five countries, Burundi (Bwiza & Maramvya), Malawi (Kauma), Tanzania (Bulale & Mwanza), Zambia (Chongwe, Kitwe, Luongo, Mongu) and Zimbabwe (Harare). We provide education, nutrition, and healthcare for over 5,200 orphans and vulnerable children. We also provide Shelter for children who do not have a safe place to live. Discipleship of our children is of high importance at all VOH Africa locations.

Our mission is to bring lasting hope to orphans and vulnerable children throughout Africa by providing them with holistic (emotional, intellectual, physical, social, spiritual) and loving care so they can embrace adulthood as contributing members of society.

Our holistic approach ensures that we care for the whole person:

- Emotionally, by providing psycho-social care, counselling, and child-friendly environments

- Intellectually, by providing education and skills training
- Physically, by providing nutrition, health care, sport, and exercise programs
- Socially, by teaching them the importance of being kind to one another and supporting and encouraging one another
- Spiritually, by introducing them to God through solid Bible teaching, clubs, and spiritual communities and by showing them God's love through our care

MISSION CANADA

Mission Canada serves the PAOC as the national mission agency reaching “missional gaps” in Canada. As a Pentecostal family, we have determined to extend and increase our reach into gap areas across the nation. There are places where we must position specific workers to be present. There are people groups to whom we must take the good news of the gospel. And, there are unique settings and opportunities where we must be, engaging those who are searching for hope and purpose in life.

Mission Canada’s strength is the collective passion, insight, and vision of proven leaders and local practitioners focused on five missional priorities:

- **Canada’s Next Generation:** children, youth and post-secondary campus students
- The people of **Quebec and Francophones** in other provinces
- **Cultural Language Groups and Newcomers to Canada**
- **Canada’s Indigenous Peoples:** First Nations, Métis and Inuit
- Those who live in Canada’s growing **Urban Centres**

Our mission agency is led by Brian Egert, director for Mission Canada. Teams across the country facilitate and guide the network and co-ordinate efforts in partnership with districts and local partners. Mission Canada is committed to this nation, and to the PAOC’s vital role in

Christ’s mission here, seeing greater clarity, unified strategies, and more targeted effectiveness.

The challenges we face in our nation are first and foremost moved through prayer. Pray that hearts will be challenged to disciple, to multiply ministry and mission intentionally for greater effectiveness, and to be socially responsible with the issues we face in Canada. As Christ followers who are working daily to advance His kingdom, we know that prayer is a crucial part of what we do. The Word clearly tells us to pray without ceasing, to bring our prayers and petitions, to devote ourselves to prayer, and to be faithful in prayer. Will you commit to praying daily with us for our nation?

Here are ways we can pray for Mission Canada and for our nation:

1. Pray for a renewed passion on the part of all Canadian believers to share the love of Christ with friends and neighbours. Pray that Christians would be intentional in sharing their faith every day and that each of us would stand for godly principles based on God’s Word.

2. Pray for more “mission-entrepreneurs”—those with strong creativity and innovative ideas who are willing to step out into unique settings and partner with Mission Canada and the work PAOC is doing in our nation.

3. Locations where workers are most urgently needed are in Quebec and throughout Francophone Canada. We are excited that people are responding to the need in French Canada. Pray for more workers to go to this province and for French-speaking workers who can reach into communities with high Francophone populations. As people respond to God's call, pray for those who will register with Mission Canada's FIT4M program (French Intensive Training 4 Ministry). Ask God to help them in their studies as they pursue their passion for the French language and people whom God loves.

4. Ask God for more workers who would bring the message of God's love and hope to our Indigenous population in cities, rural areas and on reserves. Believe with us for a greater impact in sharing the gospel message with Canada's Indigenous Peoples.

5. Pray for our next generation as they are growing up in a rapidly changing world and facing challenges unique to today. We need workers who will reach Canada's children and youth in creative and innovative ways, bringing God's story to them in ways they will understand and accept. Pray also for our young adults, many of whom are studying on Canadian university and college campuses. We are believing for a greater presence of Pentecostal workers on our post-secondary campuses in the coming years. We want to bring a message of hope

and freedom found in Christ where there is often darkness, depression and despair. Pray also for those who are international students coming to our nation to further their studies. May they find Christ as they come to Canada. Intercede for our next generation and their families, that they would live according to Christ's plan for them and that they would be spiritually strong and on mission!

6. Intercede for our cities in Canada. They are the hubs for much of the activity that shapes society. Pray that our Mission Canada workers would know God's favour and have strong inroads with those of various socio-economic levels and cultural language groups, leading many to Christ. Ask God to raise up more leaders who would go to our urban cores to be salt and light in settings that are very busy, diverse and complex.

7. Pray for the work Mission Canada does in partnership with Immigration, Refugees, and Citizenship Canada (IRCC). The PAOC is a Sponsorship Agreement Holder with the Canadian government. Through the Private Sponsorship of Refugees program, we work with PAOC churches desirous of resettling refugees who have fled their homelands due to persecution and or death threats. Pray for our PAOC local church resettlement teams and the 600+ refugees we have welcomed. Pray that more churches would

come on board to sponsor a family in need of resettlement.

8. Pray for Canadians to more intentionally engage with those of other faiths and those with no Christian faith, sharing the reason for our hope found in Jesus Christ. In today's changing face of Canada, we only need to step out of our front door to connect with those in need of a Saviour. Mission Canada's Neighbours & Newcomers Network strategically seeks to place full-time workers in and among people groups of another faith. Pray for friendships to develop, and for opportunities for believers to share daily life with their neighbours and those new to Canada. Pray that many would experience a personal encounter with Christ and know the life transformation that He can bring.

9. Pray for those who give leadership to the work of Mission Canada:

- David Wells - PAOC general superintendent
- Brian Egert - Mission Canada director
- Natalie Rogge - strategic manager
- Gary Connors, Charles Hermelink, Kevin Rogers, John Engels, Dan Collado, Andy Gabruch, Natalie Rogge – priority group co-ordinators
- Christy Rich - administrator
- PAOC district superintendents who act as the Mission Canada committee

- Mission Canada staff and guiding group members
- Pray for innovative ideas that will help to move our mission forward and reach those within the five priorities we have identified.

10. As you pray for the various Mission Canada workers featured in this prayer guide, pray for others to respond to His call to become full-time workers who would go into hard places and to identified people groups. Pray for partnerships with local churches to be strengthened as workers share stories of God at work in their various priority areas.

MULTIPLY NETWORK

The Multiply Network exists to inspire, initiate, resource, and champion church multiplication in our PAOC family. We desire to see every Canadian have an access point to the gospel.

Here are the 10 things we're praying for in the next 10 years in order to see that accomplished:

1. A Spirit-led vision to grow in the heart of every pastor, leader, member, and attender of our PAOC churches, to reach those far from God in Canada.

It's not enough for us to just say those far from God are incredibly important, we must put our words into action. We are praying for the Holy Spirit, at a very grassroots local level, to convict the hearts of all followers of Christ and for them to see themselves as being on mission every day. We are believing for a sense of urgency to be sparked in all of our hearts, so that we don't delay in living out the mission of Christ.

2. A significant increase in the number of new disciple-making communities in our PAOC family.

We're asking God to triple the number that we are currently planting each year. This is a bold prayer, but one that is necessary if we have hopes of taking ground for the kingdom of God in Canada. Our current rate of church multiplication is just barely keeping up with

population growth. That should not be our goal. To see significant movement in our Fellowship, doubling and even tripling our output of new disciple-making communities should be a major priority. Systems, structures, processes, and pathways are being developed now, but not at a quick enough pace. We need prayer for Spirit-led wisdom and supernatural efficiency as we work towards this audacious goal.

3. Creative new models and fresh expressions of disciple-making communities which will reach the millennial generation and younger.

While we have seen success with different models of church in our 100-year history, those models may not serve us as well in the future as they have in the past. The need for creative and effective disciple-making communities, especially for millennials and younger, must be something we prayerfully consider moving forward.

4. That the apostolic leaders in our churches feel released and are given permission to plant many new disciple-making communities where the Lord is leading them.

We must honour all the gifts in the church, including our leaders who have more of an apostolic passion. We need to pray for these leaders and churches to be more courageous in mission while also praying for new ideas for pathways and processes, at

district and national levels, which will make church multiplication as simple as possible.

5. Simple, practical, and manageable multiplication models which will inspire bi-vocational and co-vocational multipliers.

We believe a big part of our future will involve bi-vocational and co-vocational church multiplication. (A bi-vocational pastor has a second, unrelated, income-generating job apart from his pastoral role. A co-vocational pastor serves in both a church/ministry setting and a secular setting, with a focus in both places on church planting.)

With the expenses and resources required for entrepreneurial and multisite disciple-making communities, we need to look at developing less expensive and resource-heavy models of ministry. We need to pray for marketplace ministers to start new churches and

ministries in rural, urban, and suburban areas of Canada.

6. Robust, readied funds and invested financial partners.

We must pray for those kingdom builders with financial resources to

have a strong conviction to see the kingdom of God advanced in Canada through church multiplication. We also need their wisdom, insight, and counsel in the areas God has gifted them to help ease the leadership load many of our church multipliers feel.

7. The development and implementation of

effective leadership pathways to recruit and train new church multipliers.

We believe that our future as a movement will rise and fall on leadership. It is imperative then that we develop strong leadership

development pathways for those of all ages so they can answer the call to be commissioned into church multiplication. We are asking the Lord of the harvest to send more workers into His fields.

8. Residencies and apprenticeships at a local church level to train young and emerging church multipliers.

We are praying that some of our churches will become training hubs for prospective and new church multipliers. We think some practical, on-site learning at a local level will be so beneficial for those needing some ground-level learning. We see mentoring and coaching relationships as such a valuable resource.

9. Innovative programs and degrees at our Bible colleges, specializing in church multiplication.

We are so grateful for all the creative efforts and programs happening at our colleges now. We are believing that our Bible college leadership will come up with cutting-edge training and resourcing as we move towards becoming a church multiplication movement again.

10. That the disciple-making communities we are starting now will grandparent new communities within the next 10 years.

We can't be satisfied with just addition when it comes to starting new disciple-making communities. We must be laser-focused on multiplication, intent on seeing those new churches and communities multiply themselves over and over again. We won't see significant growth in our PAOC family unless we constantly keep multiplication in our vision and focus.

The Multiply Network exists to inspire, initiate, resource, and champion church multiplication in our PAOC family. We desire to see every Canadian have an access point to the gospel.
