The Lead Pastor is responsible for ensuring that priorities and responsibilities are achieved through personal involvement and/or delegation.

PRIORITIES:

- Excellence in Biblically-sound preaching and teaching.
- Visionary and strategic team-based leadership.
- Development of the ministry team personally, professionally, and spiritually.
- Intentional and trust-filled delegation, setting clear expectations with empowering boundaries.

QUALIFICATIONS:

The Lead Pastor must be hold a Canadian citizenship and be ordained with The Pentecostal Assemblies of Canada (PAOC) or hold another credential leading to ordination with the PAOC.

ACCOUNTABILITY:

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Responsible for all ministries and activities including administration, finance,
 governance, and pastoral care

PREACHING & TEACHING (approximately 40%):

- Provide overall leadership for worship services and special services of the church
- In charge of and give direction to the preaching and teaching ministry of the church
- Devote the necessary time in study, prayer, and preparation for weekly worship services, and other ministry responsibilities
- Administer the ordinances of the Lord's Supper and baptism
- Officiate at special services such as weddings, funerals, baby dedications,
 and other church family events as required

LEADERSHIP (Leadership, Administration and Pastoral Care combine for 60%):

- Provide leadership, first among the pastoral staff, Board, committees,
 and congregation
- Collaborate with the pastoral staff and Board to identify ministry priorities which will move the church closer to our vision and mission
- Responsible for ensuring that strategic initiatives developed by the church leadership are carried out with excellence and in accordance with our mission and vision

ADMINISTRATION:

- Serve as the Chair of the Board and church business meetings
- Oversee the administration and management of all areas of the church's ministry in consultation with the Board
- Serve as ex-officio member of all committees, with the overall church mission and vision in mind

PASTORAL CARE:

- Responsible for ensuring that the spiritual needs of the congregation are cared for through various ministries of Crossroads Church, in conjunction with the pastoral staff
- Responsible for nurturing the health and wellness of all staff mentally, spiritually, emotionally, and physically
- Ensure personal pastoral care is provided to those in crisis, including appropriate professional referrals when necessary

CHURCH HISTORY

Crossroads Church was established in Prince Albert as a Pentecostal assembly, growing from a small gathering of believers seeking Spirit-empowered ministry. Affiliated with the PAOC, it has served the community for decades, focusing on local outreach and family discipleship. The church has expanded its facilities to include a mortgage-free building with a gym and a main sanctuary seating 300, supporting vibrant worship and community events.

Over its history, Crossroads Church has been focused on a few essentials:
